UWIG

Deadline: February 16

UWIG (Utility Wind Integration Group) announced a scholarship program. To be eligible for scholarship assistance, a student must be currently enrolled at an accredited trade school or college in the United States or Canada in a field of study that could lead to a career related to utility power engineering or operation and maintenance of utility-scale wind equipment. These scholarships and stipends are intended to encourage completion of a college education or vocational degrees and programs, as well as to further the education of students, UWIG said.

UWIG may award up to three scholarships each year. Up to two \$2,000 scholarships will be granted to students enrolled in an accredited engineering school who are pursuing a career in power engineering with a focus or major on wind generation, **and up to one \$1,000 scholarship to a student enrolled in an accredited wind technician program.** The scholarships cover a single academic year and are not renewable. The \$2,000 scholarships for the 2009-2010 academic term will be targeted toward students enrolled in undergraduate programs.
